Template to Prepare for Immigration Stops

Pre-Travel Preparation

1. Document Checklist:

- Valid Passport
- Visa (if required)
- Boarding Pass
- Return Ticket
- Proof of Accommodation
- Travel Insurance
- Any Required Vaccination Certificates

2. Copies of Important Documents:

- Photocopy of Passport
- Photocopy of Visa
- Travel Itinerary
- Contact Information of Embassy/Consulate

3. Packing Essentials:

- Keep all documents in a secure, easily accessible place
- Pack essential medications in carry-on luggage
- Ensure electronic devices are charged and can be powered on if requested

At the Airport

1. Before Security Check:

- Ensure all documents are organized and easily accessible
- Double-check that no prohibited items are in your luggage

2. During Security Check:

- Follow all instructions from security personnel
- Be prepared to remove shoes, belts, and jackets if requested
- Keep electronics and liquids in the designated bins

At the Immigration Counter

1. Behavior:

- Stay calm and composed
- Be polite and respectful to immigration officers
- Avoid making jokes or behaving suspiciously

2. Questions to Expect:

- Purpose of your visit
- Duration of stay

- Accommodation details
- Proof of financial means
- Travel history and future travel plans

3. Documents to Provide:

- Passport
- Visa (if applicable)
- Boarding Pass
- Return Ticket
- Proof of Accommodation
- Invitation Letter (if visiting someone)

4. Additional Tips:

- Answer questions truthfully and succinctly
- Do not volunteer unnecessary information
- If you do not understand a question, politely ask for clarification

If Stopped or Questioned Further

1. During the Stop:

- Remain calm and cooperative
- Provide any additional documents or information requested
- Ask for a translator if you are not comfortable with the language

2. Contact Information:

- Keep the contact information of your country's embassy or consulate handy
- Have an emergency contact person who is aware of your travel plans

3. Know Your Rights:

- You have the right to ask for legal assistance
- \circ $\;$ You have the right to contact your embassy or consulate

After the Immigration Process

1. Review Documents:

- Ensure all your documents are returned to you
- Double-check that your passport has the correct entry stamp
- 2. Follow-Up:
 - Notify your emergency contact that you have cleared immigration
 - Keep all documents safe and accessible during your stay
